Counselors meet with parents/ guardians to:

- Provide support for parents seeking help
- Provide information regarding available community resources
- Share information about their child within the boundaries of the counselor's professional ethics
- Review student academic performance

Counselors consult with staff and other professionals to:

- Help identify and assist students with academic difficulties
- Assist administration in coordinating activities such as orientation, testing and course selection
- Assist staff in teaching curriculum dealing with developmental guidance
- Make referrals to community agencies when necessary
