OLOH MUSIC BEAT January 2025 Edition

Happy New Year, music families! I hope you had a joyful holiday season! I am excited for all the musical adventures ahead in 2025. Here is a glimpse at what the students will be working on this month.

In 4K music it's all about snow, snow, snow! This month we will be singing songs about snowmen, snow, and penguins! We might even sneak in a song or two about elephants too! Ask your child about Melody the Elephant! The children love to sing to her!

In kindergarten music students will focus on preparing to read rhythms through word rhythms, as well as accompany the story "The Snowy Day" with instruments and singing. We will also reinforce the different types of voices we use: singing, shouting, speaking, whispering, etc.

In first grade music the students started clapping the rhythm of the day to reinforce rhythm reading skills. They also learned to create word rhythms and accompany a story called "The Snowy Day" with instruments to create a soundscape.

In second grade music the students continue to improve upon their melodic and rhythm i c

reading skills. We will be working more with playing instruments this month as well.

This month the students will learn "Alleluia! Give the Glory" and "Abba Father" to sing for Masses. We will also talk about our featured composer, Ludwig van Beethoven. He wrote so many famous pieces of music and the students are having fun listening to and playing along with it all!
