Welcome to the February music newsletter! It's hard to believe we're already over 100 days into the school year! The students have been busy learning lots of new songs and concepts and I'm excited to share what we've got coming up this month! This will be a month filled with lots of Valentine songs and activities!

Our composer of the month is Scott Joplin, the King of Ragtime music. We will some fun doing rhythm play alongs as well as listen to some of his most famous pieces, such as Maple Leaf Rag and The Entertainer. For Mass music, we will begin to prepare for the Lenten season.

In 4K, we will be honing in on the concepts of loud/quiet, fast/slow, and up/ down. We will sing songs and say poems about food and create word rhythms using food picture cards. This is one of the beginning stages of reading rhythm. The students are also getting more and more confident singing solos in class, especially to Melody the Elephant!

In Kindergarten, we had fun singing along to the story of Sleeping Beauty. We have also been singing songs about trains, which reinforces the idea of fast and slow in music. Later this month we will make a class book for the song Alice the Camel which has been a hit with the previous kindergarten classes.

In First grade, we learned a song from Ghana called Kye Kye Koolay and learned about call and response songs. Later in the month the students will create a class book for the song Aikendrum and accompany the song on instruments. The students are also improving their rhythm reading skills with our rhythm of the day.

In Second grade, we learned a Native American song called "Gitsigakomim" which means "I love you." We played a stick passing game while singing the song which was a great beat keeping and concentration skill to learn. For Valentine's Day, we will be playing a rhythm matching game. Students will also learn about ABAC form with the song "Ham and Eggs."

The First and Second graders will also begin a Mallet Madness unit where they will get to explore playing xylophones, glockenspiels and drums.

At the end of the month, we will begin working on our spring concert music. (I know that's hard to believe!) Our concert will be for 4K-2<sup>nd</sup> grade students and will be Tuesday, April 29<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 pm. I'm so excited to include our 4K students in this concert! Please mark your calendar for this wonderful evening of music that our students will be so excited to share with you!
