God's hand has been planting missionary seeds at Assumption since the 1990s when He placed now-Monsignor Joe Hirsch as the school's chaplain for eight years.

During his time at Assumption, Father Joe organized the first mission trip to Peru in 1996. It would take another 20 years before another group of Assumption students, parents, and teachers made the journey.

In the past decade, more than 50 members of the Assumption community have traveled to Casa Hogar, bringing with them over \$30,000 in donations—generously contributed by Assumption families and the Wisconsin Rapids Deanery.

This summer, another group of Assumption families will continue this tradition, journeying to Peru to support Monsignor Hirsch as he carries on Fr. Walijewski's mission of providing for children in need.





Board of Directors/Parent Meeting Minutes Wednesday, February 5, 2025 4:30 pm AHS Library



Present: Daniel Minter, ACS President & Board Member Kerry Meinel, ACS Enrollment, WPCP/SNSP Coordinator Beth Kuhn, SV Principal and Parent Shelley Bruley, OLQH Principal Amber France, AMS/AHS Principal and Parent Josh Thomas, OLQH Parent Lindsay Graumann, OLQH, SV, AMS, AHS Parent Fr. Schaller –Dean and Board Member was not present due to illness.

The meeting was called to order and opening prayer was led by Mr. Minter at 4:30 pm.

- Kerry Meinel gave an update on enrollment. OLQH 100 students/ SV 87 students/ AMS 101 students/ AHS 120 students for a total enrollment of 408.
 192 WPCP students 2 partial WPCP 24 SNSP students and 5 partial SNSP
- As part of the Wisconsin Parental Choice Program participation, ACS is required to complete a 3rd Friday in September attendance count and a 2nd Friday in January attendance count, both of which are followed up with audits(enrollment and financial).
- Enrollment/re-enrollment and WPCP applications opened on February 3rd and will run through April 17th.
- Testing information-see attached for both system wide assessments and those required for the WPCP.
- The Finance and Education Commissions are made up of representatives of the deanery parishes. They meet the 3rd Tuesday of every month. While administrators and other employees attend the meetings, the parish representatives are the only voting members. If a parent would like to attend the Commission meeting and add an item to the agenda, they should reach out to Mr. Craig Smits, the Chair of the Commission. The list of members and meeting minutes are on the ACS website Membership List Assumption Catholic Schools The role of these boards is advisory. Finance assists in reviewing the budget and monthly finances, while the Education Commission assists in review of policies, handbooks, and other issues that arise. The WPCP Board of Directors consists of Fr. Schaller and Mr. Minter. Per State requirement, Assumption Catholic Schools holds two Board of Directors meetings per year. The purpose is to inform parents on the State of the Schools, provide updates to parents, and to answer parent questions.
- Writing/updating policies and decision making falls on individual administrators, the President
 and the Dean. The Diocese and the DPI have policies in place that ACS abides by and builds on.
 An example would be summative and formative testing. The Diocese requires testing. ACS
 determines which assessments will be administered. The DPI requires that WPCP students take
 certain assessments. ACS decides whether all of our students will take these assessments. State
 statute requires a set number of hours of instruction per year. The DPI does not offer guidance
 regarding curriculum, but does require following certain initiatives like the ACT 20 Science of
 Reading.

Thank you to all who attended the meeting.

 The Next Board of Directors Meeting will take place in the Fall. The two meeting dates for next year will published this summer.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:17 pm.
