ABSENCE PROCEDURE REMINDER

Daily attendance is essential to success in school. In the event that a student will be absent or tardy, the parent or guardian must call or email the school office by 7:45 am.

When a student has to leave school for an appointment of any kind, a note, email or call must be made to the school office so a pass can be given to the student for dismissal. If late or leaving/returning from an appointment, the student must sign the IN/OUT Log located in the office.

Students must attend a full day of classes in order to participate in a school-sponsored extracurricular activity or practice.

*Exceptions of faith/family events that are deemed by the administration to be absolutely necessary or any other activity, event or appointment that has been approved by administration and does not remove a student from school for more than three periods (2 ½ hours).

Additionally, we understand that sometimes school events or athletic events will run quite late, but students are still expected to be in school on the day following that event.




