Dear OLQH Families,

As we progress further into the school year, I want to remind you of the critical role good attendance plays in your child's success. Did you know that every day a student is absent represents a missed opportunity for learning? Excessive absences not only impact the achievement of the student who is missing but can also disrupt the learning environment for the entire class.

Here's how you can help ensure your child's regular attendance:

- Set a consistent bedtime and morning routine to help your child start each day smoothly.
- Lay out clothes and pack backpacks the night before to reduce morning stress.
- Avoid scheduling vacations during the school year whenever possible.
- Discuss the importance of attending school regularly and check in with your child about how they feel about school.
- If your child is feeling anxious about going to school, reach out to their teachers, school counselors, or other parents for support and strategies to make school a positive experience.
- Schedule medical appointments outside of school hours whenever possible.
- Only keep your child home if they are truly ill. Use a thermometer to check for fever, and remember that complaints like stomach aches or headaches could be linked to anxiety rather than illness.
- Have a back-up plan in case unexpected situations arise. Ask a family member, neighbor, or another parent for help if needed.

Thank you for all that you do to support your child's success and well-being, as well as the success of our school community.
