
Lord Jesus, I TRUST in You.

"Whatever is going on in my life, whatever season I'm going through ... 'I know you are good, and I know I can trust you. Because you are good, I know I can trust you.'

"Just because I don't understand the meaning of this moment doesn't mean this moment doesn't have meaning."

"It's a gift of the Lord to be able to recognize 'I trust you,'" the priest underscored, adding that if one doesn't feel this way, "Pray to God and say: 'God, help me to trust you. Trust isn't a feeling — it is a conviction."

It is confidence or reliance on God's goodness, faithfulness, and promises.

Biblical Examples

- **Abraham:** Trusted God's promise of a son despite old age (Genesis 21:1-7).
- **Daniel:** He was thrown into the lions' den for praying to God, defying King Darius's decree. Daniel trusted in God's protection and continued to pray despite the threat to his life. God sent an angel to shut the lions' mouths, and Daniel was unharmed (Daniel 6).

Biblical Examples


Thomas: Doubted Jesus' resurrection until he saw Him (John 20:24-29).

Peter: Began to sink when he doubted while walking on water (Matthew 14:29-31).

WHAT HAPPENS WHEN WE DOUBT?

Fear and Anxiety: Doubt can lead to worry and stress.

Distance from God: Creates a barrier in the relationship with God, making it harder to feel His presence and guidance.






Many, many people throughout history have experienced doubt.

8 WAYS TO BUILD TRUST TRUST

- 1. Follow through on promises and commitments. If you say you'll do something, do it.
- 2. Pay attention to what the person is saying without interrupting.
- 3. Express your appreciation for what others do for you.
- 4. Maintain a positive attitude, which can create a more enjoyable and trustworthy atmosphere.
- 5. Collaborate on projects or activities, which can build trust through cooperation and teamwork.
- 6. Be on time for meetups and events to show that you value the other's time.
- 7. If you make a mistake, apologize sincerely. Take responsibility for your actions without making excuses.
- 8. Be willing to forgive others when they make mistakes. Holding grudges can erode trust.







SAINT STORY

ST. LOUIS BERTRAND

October 9 1526-1581

Louis was born in Valencia Spain, in a family of nine children. His good parents brought him up well, and he became a Dominican priest.

At the age of thirty-six, St. Louis left for South America. He stayed in the New World only about six years, but in that short time, this great apostle baptized thousands of persons.

Although he knew only Spanish, God gave him the gift of tongues, so that when he spoke, all the different tribes of Indians understood him.

Yet his apostolate was not without dangers. A tribe called the Caribs of the Leeward Islands even tried to poison the saint when he visited them to preach the gospel of Our Lord.

Once he was called back to Spain, St. Louis trained other preachers, teaching them to prepare themselves by fervent prayer, first of all.

And the disciples were astonished at his words.


But Jesus again answering, saith to them: Children, how hard is it for them that trust in riches, to enter into the kingdom of God?

And Jesus looking on them, saith: With men it is impossible; but not with God: for all things are possible with God.




